Special Vet at the Park Event Returns to Baldwin Park

LOS ANGELES, CA - The City of Baldwin Park, in partnership with the County of Los Angeles Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC), invites the community to bring their furry friends to a special Vet @ The Park event on Sunday, February 11, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Morgan Park for free veterinarian services. This event comes on the heels of a very successful Vet @ The Park event in October 2023.

The event, also supported by the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation and Wallis Annenberg PetSpace, will feature a pop-up veterinarian clinic offering a wide range of free services to Baldwin Park pet owners, including exams, vaccines, microchipping, flea medication, deworming and basic pet supplies. Coming on the heels of a very successful Vet @ The Park event in October 2023, the City of Baldwin Park is giving pet owners another opportunity to protect their four-legged friends while enjoying a day in the park.

“Our Vet @ The Park services bring critical medical care and resources to pet owners in their own neighborhoods for free,” said DACC Director Marcia Mayeda. “DACC is committed to supporting healthy and thriving communities for pets and their families, which is why we aim to eliminate financial and geographic barriers preventing pet owners from getting the services they need for their pets.”

“The City of Baldwin Park is proud to bring back this Vet @ The Park event with the help of our partners,” said Baldwin Park Mayor Emmanuel J. Estrada. “This is a fantastic chance for residents to see veterinary professionals at no cost. We know how important pets are to so many families and hope pet-owners can take advantage of this opportunity to ensure their pets’ health, as well as connect with the network of pet owners in Baldwin Park.”

To ensure the safety of all people and pets, the City of Baldwin Park asks that all dogs remain on leash and cats be in a carrier at all times during the event. The use of masks is strongly recommended. Please do not bring sick pets, and note that two adults will be required for those bringing multiple pets. All veterinary services will be performed on a first-come, first-serve walk-in basis as time permits, so pet owners are encouraged to arrive at the earlier end of the event. Pet licensing will also be available for a cost. Cash and checks will be accepted as payment.

DACC is grateful to all its event partners, including the City of Baldwin Park, the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation, and Wallis Annenberg PetSpace, for their help in making this unique opportunity available to the community.
