The City of Baldwin Park to continue community engagement: “It Takes a Village! Proposed Tiny Home Village Non-Congregate Shelter”

Baldwin Park, Calif. (Tuesday, June 22, 2021) – According to the 2020 Baldwin Park Homeless Count, there are 556 people experiencing homelessness in our community. As part of the City of Baldwin Park’s efforts to find equitable housing opportunities for all residents, the City’s Department of Recreation and Community Services will be hosting part II of the community engagement process for the “It Takes a Village! Proposed (Tiny Home Village) Non-Congregate Shelter” via zoom on Thursday, June 24 at 7 pm.

There are many questions around homelessness and the resources available for the unsheltered populations in our community. The first step to ending homelessness in our community is to educate our community about the issue.

Join this second virtual event to learn the FACTS about the (Tiny Home Village) Emergency Non-Congregate Shelter pilot program seeking to come to the City of Baldwin Park at the proposed site located at 14173 Garvey Ave. Baldwin Park, CA 91706, through a pilot program by The San Gabriel Valley Regional Housing Trust (SGVRHT) and San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) to help our unhoused neighbors.


It takes a village to plan and coordinate a Tiny Home Village where our homeless neighbors can find bridge housing while waiting to find a place to call home. Learn from our field experts on issues such as the Project Background, Boss Cubez Product, Site Plan and Safety Overview, Site Amenities and Zoning & Planning issues/concerns. The proposed site will provide interim housing with support services while connecting clients to permanent supportive housing.

Participants will have the opportunity to view the conceptual site plan and learn the details regarding the project infrastructure needs for more bridge housing for our unhoused neighbors and help them successfully transition to permanent housing.

In-person orientation tours will also be available at the proposed site on Saturday 6/26 from 10am-2pm and Tuesday, 6/29 from 4pm-7pm. Together, we CAN end homelessness in our community.
