City of Baldwin Park to Host Vaccination Event in Partnership with Supervisor Hilda L. Solis

Baldwin Park, Calif. (Thursday, April 29, 2021) – On Saturday, May 1st between 8:00 a.m. and 4 p.m., the City of Baldwin Park, in partnership with Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda L. Solis, Assemblymember Blanca E. Rubio, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, El Proyecto del Barrio, and the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, will host a vaccination event to fight against COVID-19. The vaccination event will occur at the Arts & Recreation Center 14404-B Pacific Avenue in Baldwin Park. The vaccine being administered on-site will be Moderna. COVID-19 vaccines are FREE regardless of insurance or immigration status to everyone over 18 years of age.

“Only 45.6% of residents in Baldwin Park have received their first dose of the vaccine, meaning our residents are still not fully protected,” shared Chair Solis. “As we look at the overall County average of 50% vaccination rate with the first dose, my office in partnership with local entities such as our Department of Public Health and El Proyecto del Barrio are committed to closing the gaps in vaccination rates. Only by bringing vaccines directly to the community will we ensure our communities are protected and come out stronger from this pandemic.”

“California has made strides in ending this pandemic by working together, which is why I am honored to partner with other elected officials and organizations to provide an accessible vaccination site in the 48th Assembly District. As we see our schools and economy reopen and as case rates decline, we must continue to do our share in protecting one another by getting vaccinated.”

Mayor Emmanuel J. Estrada said, “We are excited to collaborate with Supervisor Chair Hilda L. Solis and Assemblymember Blanca E. Rubio to increase access to vaccination that will help protect even more of our community. As a city, Baldwin Park plays an important role in supporting community health. Making sure our residents can get vaccinated is critical to beating this virus. Through our partnership with our state and county elected officials, we have the opportunity to use our resources to serve our community.”
