Kaiser Permanente and City of Baldwin Park to Open New Vaccination Site as State Expands Vaccine Eligibility

BALDWIN PARK, Calif. – April 2, 2021 – At a time when California is expanding COVID-19 vaccine eligibility, Kaiser Permanente and the city of Baldwin Park are teaming up to provide vaccinations at the Esther Snyder Community Center located at 4100 Baldwin Park Blvd., Baldwin Park, starting Monday, April 5.

This new site will provide greater access to additional eligible populations, and is part of Kaiser Permanente’s focused efforts to reach communities that have been hardest hit by COVID-19. Vaccines will be given to Kaiser Permanente members and non-members by appointment only, and availability is dependent on supply.

To make an appointment and check vaccine eligibility, please visit kp.org/covidvaccine or call 1-833-574-2273. The vaccination site will be open Monday – Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Saturday, 7 a.m. – 3 p.m.; and will be closed on Sundays.
