

CDBG FUNDED PUBLIC SERVICE AGENCIES

BPPD PRIDE Platoon

This program is designed to provide at risk youth with proactive and innovative techniques for positive redirection. The nine session eight week long program is designed for middle school and high school students. The program uses professionals from varying fields to act as role models and provide the youth with a variety of choices and examples of the results of good conduct. The program is facilitated by Baldwin Park Police Officers. The program starts with one two day overnight outing and continues with eight hour sessions for seven Saturdays thereafter.

The Childcare Subsidy Program

This program provides working parents with financial assistance to offset the cost of childcare services. Parents and participants must be Baldwin Park Residents to qualify for the subsidy, and meet the low to moderate-income levels. Parents are allowed to select a childcare center of their choice to enroll their children as long as the provider is licensed or a City operated program. To participate in the program parents are required to provide proof of address and income verification.

ESGV Coalition for the Homeless
